

CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Twenty years ago Cynthia Ward founded True Colours, a service providing holistic support for children with a serious health diagnosis or who are grieving the loss of their baby or child, and their families.

Through the 20 years, the True Colours team's unwavering dedication to delivering high-quality care through counselling, nursing, and education is truly commendable; thank you to you all for your commitment.

True Colours recognises the importance of collaboration with other health providers to ensure the best care and support for children and families. Our services are offered at the True Colours house on Joffre Street, in family homes, and in hospitals, ensuring accessibility and comprehensive support.

We continue to focus on educating the public and health sectors through presentations at various events, collegial support to other health professionals, and professional development training. These efforts are crucial in raising awareness about the needs of seriously unwell children and their families within the community.

In March 2024, we launched our nurse-led clinic at the True Colours house. This initiative has been highly successful in meeting the needs of children and families through assessments, case management, coordination, and liaison with other providers.

The past year has been challenging for the communities that True Colours serves due to the weak financial environment.

This has also been felt by many fund providers who we rely on for financial support to keep our service operating. We are deeply grateful for the ongoing support during these tough times.

I also extend my heartfelt thanks to the many individuals and businesses who also support us. Your contributions are invaluable and enable us to continue our mission of supporting seriously unwell children and their families.

The Friends of True Colours remain integral to our organisation through their fundraising efforts, community promotion, and assistance at various events. Thank you, your support is also invaluable.

At the end of June 2025, our current CEO, Cynthia Ward, will transition to a Trustee role on the Trust Board. We acknowledge and thank Cynthia for her vision, passion and commitment in founding and growing such an important service in our community.

We warmly welcome Heidi Gleeson as the new CEO and look forward to supporting her in her new role. Heidi's passion and commitment to our mission are evident, and we are excited for the future of True Colours under her leadership.

CEO'S REPORT

As I reflect over 2024, I realise this is the last year I am writing this report as CE. 2024 has been a solid year of ensuring the operational, nursing and psychosocial aspect of True Colours are solidly in place before the end of my tenure in this role.

A highlight of the year was welcoming Renee Streatfield into True Colours in March as the clinical nurse specialist to operate the Nurse Led Clinic, a new initiative. From commencement, the uptake was positive, with families requiring nursing assessments for their children with health conditions. Renee will commence her nurse practitioner practicum final year in 2025 to further enhance service provision for family's TC supports, particularly as accessing medical support in the community is so challenging.

Emergency Consult continue to partner with TC to provide the afterhours support to families, providing advice, guidance and at times medications. Families appreciate this aspect of the service; the outcome is reduced ED admissions for some whānau. While this part of the service is well utilised, the numbers remain consistent and relatively small.

Another highlight of the year was to celebrate 20 years of being operational, those years all totally community funded. It epitomises the loyal continued support of sponsors, funders, individuals and businesses who have captured the vision and walk alongside us in a much-needed practical way. The appreciation and gratitude are hard to put into words. Heidi will highlight this further in her report.

Paediatric palliative care (PPC) still requires recognition in New Zealand. I have been involved on the national working group for developing a model that meets the needs for this population group. I have also been part of the Australasian working group developing clinical guidelines for PPC. While PPC is just one aspect of our care provided, there is still much work to do. This mahi will continue into 2025 working in collaboration with Rainbow Place. Currently PPC in NZ is under

resourced and children with life-limiting and lifethreatening conditions and their whānau are being compromised.

Thank you to the team at TC who provide the skilled support to tamariki, rangatahi and their whānau utilising services from TC. Without you, there would not be a service. Most days I hear from either the families themselves or health professionals who refer to TC that the support has made a positive difference. To reduce the burden of care on whānau who are doing the hard mahi is a way that will have a bigger impact on the family unit, helping them to stay standing. My thanks go to the trustees on the Board, who continue to provide the strong governance and guidance required to ensure the organisation is safe, and sustainable. Thank you for your support of me in this role, it has been so appreciated.

As I look towards 2025, I will be handing over the leadership to Heidi, for the first six months, while I am still at TC to provide mentorship and enable a smooth transition of change. I will then leave the operational side of True Colours at the end of June 2025 to rejoin the TC Trust Board as trustee. I have every faith & trust in Heidi and the team to continue the care that families have highlighted they require. When I reflect on the years passed, TC is no longer filling a gap, we are forging a way for the rest of NZ to follow, we know this model is effective for families, it meets their need. I will continue at a national level to ensure children have their voices heard, and I will be leaving TC in a strong position with Heidi and the team to directly meet the needs of tamariki & rangatahi who have serious health conditions, and their whānau.
